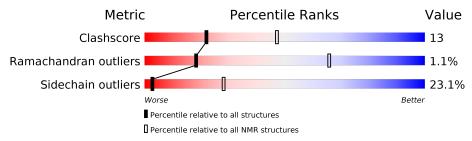

1 Overall quality at a glance (i)

The following experimental techniques were used to determine the structure: $SOLUTION\ NMR$

The overall completeness of chemical shifts assignment is 90%.

The numeric value for each fraction is indicated below the corresponding segment, with a dot representing fractions <=5%

2 Ensemble composition and analysis (i)

This entry contains 20 models. Model 17 is the overall representative, medoid model (most similar to other models). The authors have identified model 1 as representative.

The following residues are included in the computation of the global validation metrics.

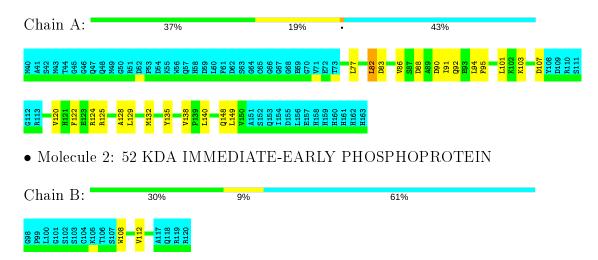


4 Residue-property plots (i)

4.1 Average score per residue in the NMR ensemble

These plots are provided for all protein, RNA and DNA chains in the entry. The first graphic is the same as shown in the summary in section 1 of this report. The second graphic shows the sequence where residues are colour-coded according to the number of geometric quality criteria for which they contain at least one outlier: green = 0, yellow = 1, orange = 2 and red = 3 or more. Stretches of 2 or more consecutive residues without any outliers are shown as green connectors. Residues which are classified as ill-defined in the NMR ensemble, are shown in cyan with an underline colour-coded according to the previous scheme. Residues which were present in the experimental sample, but not modelled in the final structure are shown in grey.

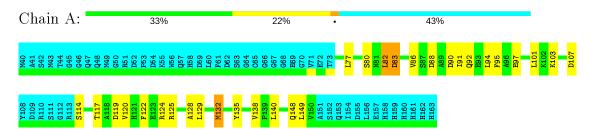

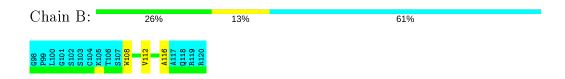

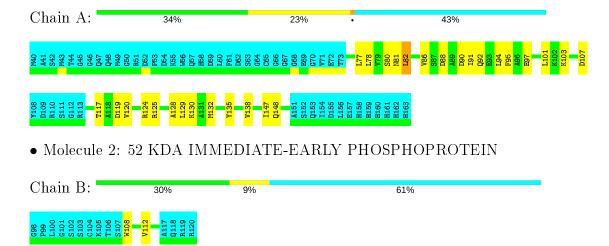
• Molecule 2: 52 KDA IMMEDIATE-EARLY PHOSPHOPROTEIN





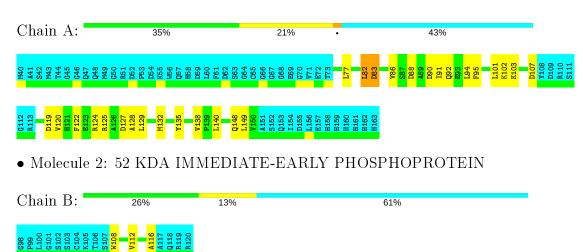

• Molecule 1: RNA AND EXPORT FACTOR-BINDING PROTEIN 2



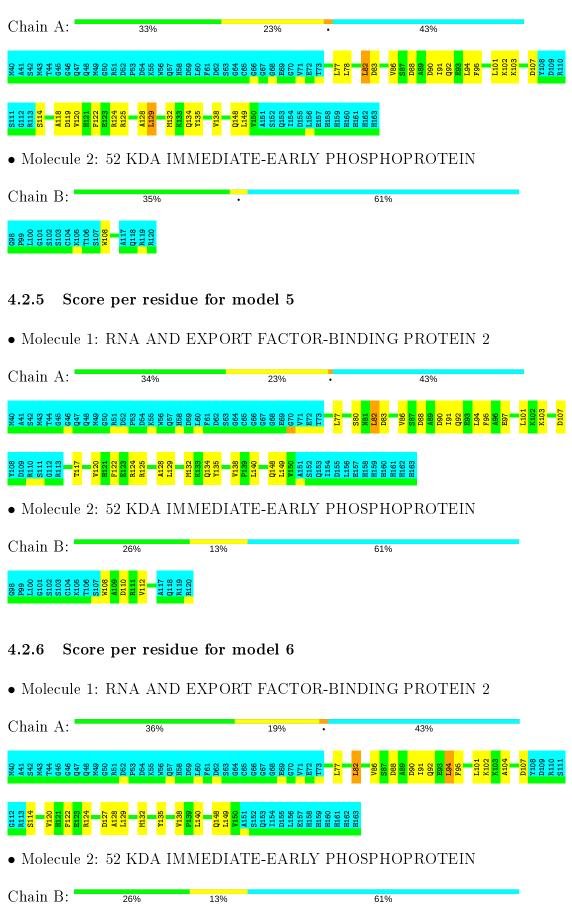

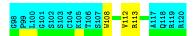

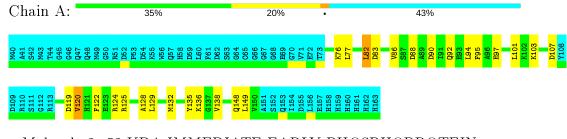

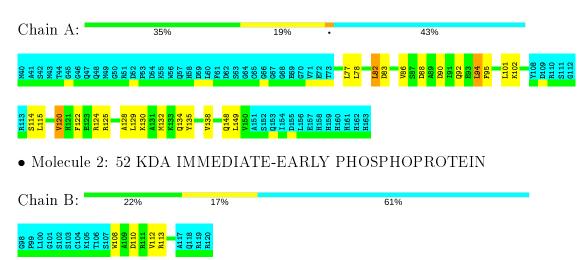

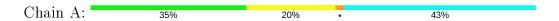

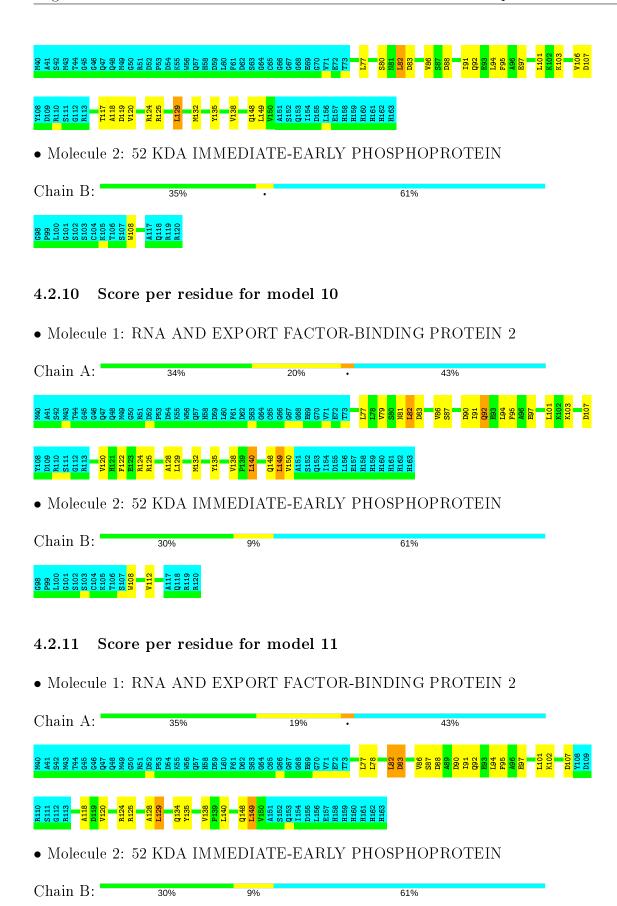

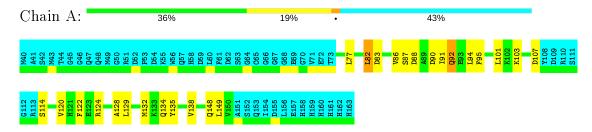

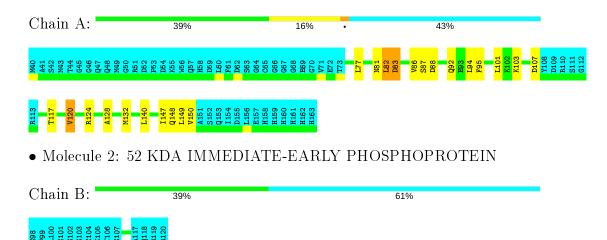


• Molecule 2: 52 KDA IMMEDIATE-EARLY PHOSPHOPROTEIN

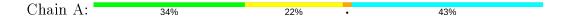

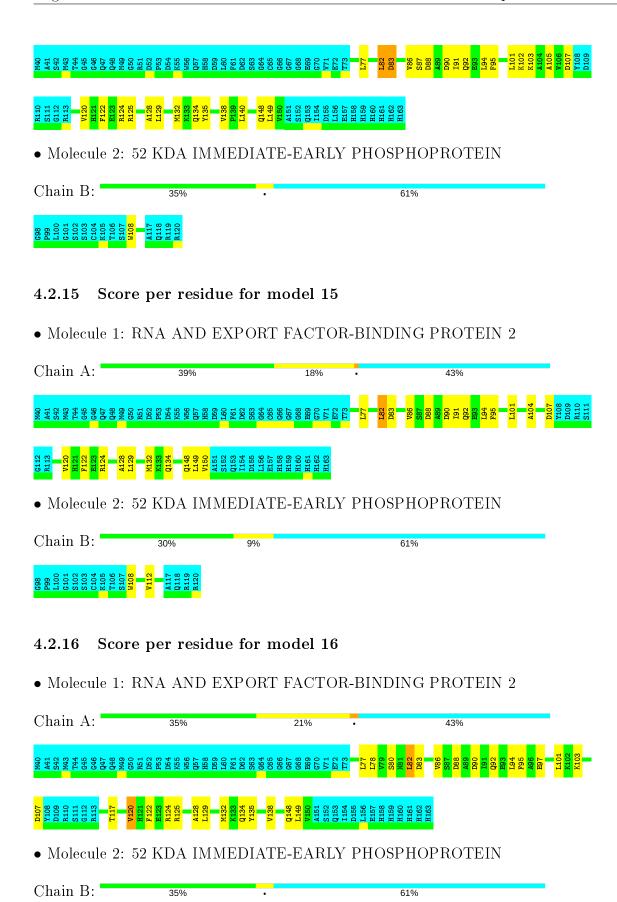

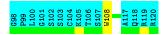

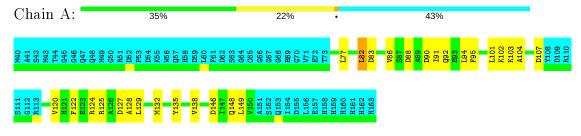






4.2.17 Score per residue for model 17 (medoid)

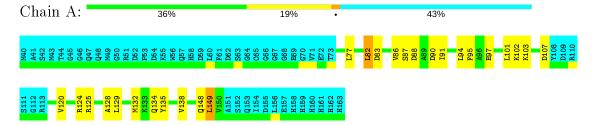

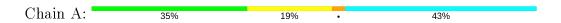

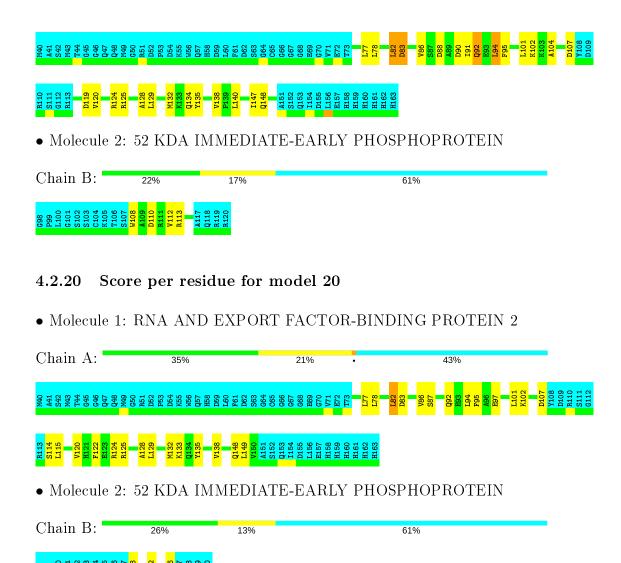

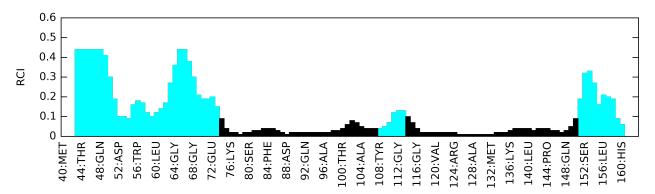

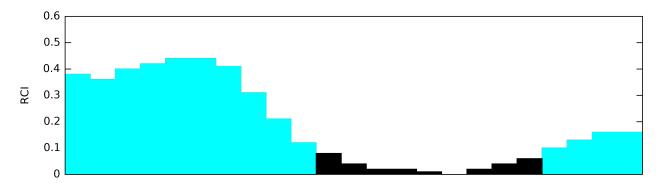
7.1.5 Random Coil Index (RCI) plots (i)

The images below report random coil index values for the protein chains in the structure. The height of each bar gives a probability of a given residue to be disordered, as predicted from the available chemical shifts and the amino acid sequence. A value above 0.2 is an indication of significant predicted disorder. The colour of the bar shows whether the residue is in the well-defined core (black) or in the ill-defined residue ranges (cyan), as described in section 2 on ensemble composition.

7.2.3 Completeness of resonance assignments (i)

The overall completeness is 81%, i.e. 781 atoms were assigned a chemical shift out of a possible 965. 14 out of 16 assigned methyl groups (LEU and VAL) were assigned stereospecifically.

7.2.5 Random Coil Index (RCI) plots (i)

The image below reports random coil index values for the protein chains in the structure. The height of each bar gives a probability of a given residue to be disordered, as predicted from the available chemical shifts and the amino acid sequence. A value above 0.2 is an indication of significant predicted disorder. The colour of the bar shows whether the residue is in the well-defined core (black) or in the ill-defined residue ranges (cyan), as described in section 2 on ensemble composition.
